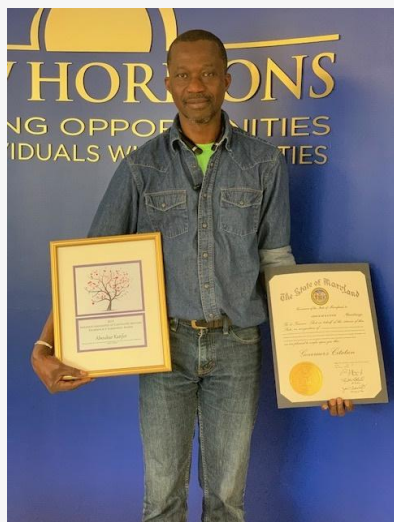
## Maryland Association of Community Services (MACS) - Direct Support & Supervision Conference 2019
